Key Vocabulary	Definition
Chord	Three or more notes played at the same time.
Harmony	When two or more notes are played together, the sounds blend to give a pleasant sound.
Rhythm	A pattern of short or long sounds that fit with the pulse.
Pulse	A steady beat like a ticking clock or <u>heartbeat</u> in the music.
Tempo	How fast or slow the music should be played.

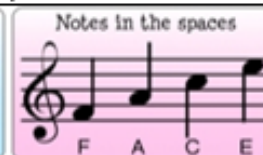
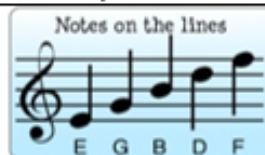
- Use rhythm stick and staff notation to transcribe ideas.
